REFUGEE SUPPORT SERVICES: A YOUNG MOTHER'S JOURNEY TOWARD STABILITY

A young refugee mother recently arrived in Kansas City this spring, facing significant challenges without immediate family support. Her husband remains in a refugee camp, awaiting the approval of his visa to join his family. Eight months into pregnancy and caring for two young children, ages five and seven, she carries not only the weight of motherhood in a new country but also the burden of a severe heart condition that will require surgery after she delivers her baby.

Her financial situation is precarious. Despite her determination to work part-time while caring for her children and navigating a complex healthcare system as an expectant mother, her \$1,000 monthly income falls far short of covering basic living costs, childcare, and medical needs. She currently receives food stamps, yet this does not fully meet her family's needs.

Through the Bethel Neighborhood Center's Refugee Support Services program, she received some immediate and vital assistance. The help Bethel has provided gives her some relief as she prepares to welcome her new baby, but it is not enough. We point her to other agencies for guidance on connecting to local resources to address her ongoing needs. Bethel is further collaborating with community partners to open pathways for long-term services, including potential intensive case management to ensure she continues receiving the care and support she needs.

This case highlights both the resilience and the hardships refugee families face as they rebuild their lives in a new community. It underscores the importance of sustained, compassionate support systems that extend beyond one-time assistance. Our young mother doesn't just need a single helping hand; she needs a community that surrounds and supports her with care and compassion. And that is exactly what we strive to provide to our families every day. Thanks for your continued support of what we do in our city.

Children enjoyed games like mop soccer, balloon ankle pop, and face painting, while families gathered for photos at our beautiful photo booth and claimed prizes from our beloved "lady rooster," Ms. Sheri. Though rain moved the celebration indoors and Bounce houses had to be cancelled, the event was a joyful success, welcoming new families and celebrating the once who have been with us for many years.



OCTOBER PANTRY UPDATE

In October, the growing need for assistance due to food insecurity in our community continues to be evident. We served up to 3 times more families each day than in past months. Our Food Pantry served a total of 444 households, providing nourishment to 790 adults, 212 seniors, and 632 children. Additionally, we supplied diapers to 51 infants. On-site, we served nearly 200 meals through our community meals, the after-school program, and various ministries.

Please continue to keep the Bethel Food Pantry in your prayers as we strive to navigate these difficult times regarding the suspension of the SNAP Program, and as we strive to keep the pantry full for the food-insecure and underserved in our community.
