AFTER SCHOOL & SUMMER PROGRAMS

Programs for youth are offered in a safe and caring environment for them to learn and grow. 1st – 12th grade students can participate in our after school and summer programs. REFUGEE ASSISTANCE

We work closely with various refugee groups to help make their transition and assimilation easier. We offer translation, advocacy, transportation and other needs.

FOOD PANTRY

Open to all Wyandotte County residents. A photo ID and a current proof of residence (e.g. BPU Bill) are necessary to receive food, diapers, and baby food.

HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

Our Parish Nurse and staff teach classes for the seniors and youth on how to live a healthier life. This program focuses on education, prevention, and early intervention to prevent obesity, diabetes and chronic disease. Our nurse is also available for consultations and questions.

SEWING CLASS

We have partnered with Once We Were



Refugees (OWWR) to offer 9-week sewing classes that touch on the basics. At the end of the program students receive a Certificates of Accomplishment, the machine they have learned on, a new pair of scissors, an iron, ironing board, thread, and 10 yards of fabric.

ESL/CITIZENSHIP CLASS
