In celebration of the new cooking skills our students achieved and their successful completion of the cooking course, we invited their family members to join the celebration. One of the activities on the day of graduation was decorating cupcakes. Although it was not a competition, the children of our students worked very hard, and their creativity was displayed in the cupcakes they decorated. Some of the children expressed their gratitude for making their moms "*a better cook*" and for the wonderful time they had on the graduation day. One of the children said, "My mom now knows how to cook American food, and I am very happy." Our cooking students learned how to prepare 16-18 dishes to complete the course. They learned how to read recipes, how to use measuring cups, food ingredients, healthy and unhealthy food, and cooked/prepared simple and easy meals like, hamburgers, spaghetti, chili, sloppy joe, hot dogs, chicken enchilada, bean casserole, banana

bread, baking turkey, and much more. They also learned how to use the oven and bake cakes for their children's birthday and other important occasions in their family.

We are very grateful to our high school students and the youth group from First Baptist Church of Louisburg, Kansas, for spreading a big truckload of mulch on our playground. We really appreciate them as it is necessary to make our playground safe for our program participants and our neighborhood residents.
