SPRING AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM NEARS COMPLETION

As our Spring after-school program wraps up, we celebrate a season of growth and impact. This semester, 99 students participated across our elementary, middle, and high school groups, engaging in academic & health education, enrichment activities, and community-building rooted in Bethel's mission. Highlights for April included a vibrant Easter Egg Hunt, supported by volunteers from a local church and others who donated Easter Gift bags for your students. Even more meaningful, seven elementary students are now transitioning to our middle school group, and three middle schoolers will join our high school program this summer. We're especially proud to honor one of our high school seniors, who has been accepted to Avila University to study sports medicine. He is also the recipient of Bethel's College scholarship.



As we are nearing the end of our spring school year, we also want to highlight that over half of our after-school staff and volunteers are former students who have returned to serve. Their commitment reflects the lasting impact of this program, and we are deeply grateful for their leadership.

Thank you to our staff, volunteers, and partners for helping us finish strong. We look forward to continuing this momentum into our summer programming!

APRIL PANTRY UPDATE

As our food pantry's reach grows, so does our inventory. In April, we supported **350 households**, nourishing **370 adults, 152 seniors, 274 children**, and providing **52 infants** with diapers. We also served nearly **300 meals** on-site through our community meals and other ministries.
